### English We will be learning to:

- Read and discuss The Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura
- Create a class anthology of time-travelling adventure stories
- Write a set of instructions for how to survive in the Stone Age

### Maths We will be learning to:

- Read and write numbers up to and over 1000
- Order and compare numbers
- Add and subtracting 1, 10 and 100 to numbers
- Solve reasoning problems

### Science We will be learning to:

- Identify and group different rocks
- Explain what a fossil is and how it is made
- Describe what soil is made of

### RE We will be learning to:

- Learn about what happens during the Hindu festival of Diwali and how it brings a sense of belonging to Hindu's.

### History We will be learning to:

- Learn what everyday life was like during the Stone Age and Iron Age
- Visit the museum of Iron Age in Andover and Danebury Hillfort
- Research and find out about Stonehenge.
